Pay Your Utility Bill With Our New Mobile App

The Town of Dyer is continually seeking ways to improve the customer experience. Several years ago the Clerk-Treasurer partnered with a leader in the payment industry, Indianapolis based PayGOV.US, to process electronic payments. This was part of a strategic, long-term goal for the community to modernize the connection between Town government and residents.

The goal has taken another step forward with the release of PayGOV's new mobile application. Available for free on both the Google Playstore and Apple Itunes the app allows residents to pay their obligations to the Town from their phone or lpad. The Town is also able, with the connection of a small card reader, to have their phones act as a mobile credit card machine. It is a mutual focus on innovation and a commitment to excellence that brought the Clerk-Treasurer and PayGOV together years ago. And, it is the ongoing efforts by both parties to provide great service that continues to strengthen the partnership.

PayGOV.US assesses a nominal convenience fee processing these transactions. American Express®, MasterCard ®, Discover ® and VISA ® along with debit cards carrying a MasterCard $^{\circ}$ 0 or Visa $^{\circ}$ 0 are accepted by the program. Citizens using credit cards with bonus rewards programs can, depending on their card's program, earn rewards, points, and cash-back on airline frequent flyer miles .

New Sidewalk on Route 30

The long awaited sidewalk project along the south side of US 30 from Calumet Avenue east to Castlewood Dr. will finally become a reality with construction beginning during the week of APRIL 21st. A sidewalk will also be constructed along the east side of Calumet Avenue from US 30 to Richard Rd. The project is scheduled to be completed by mid-May weather permitting.

This project will provide safer access for children who walk to and from Kahler School from parts of Sandy Ridge and Castlewood Subdivisions and in fact is partially funded through a state program called Safe Routes to School. It will provide the opportunity for increased pedestrian activity in general as well as bicycling accessibility in the area. Keeping the sidewalk clear of snow and ice will become the responsibility of the property owners who front US 30 and Calumet Avenue in that area.

A Message From Animal Control

The Canine Influenza, H3N2, has been confirmed in our area. We have all followed the news regarding the Canine Flu outbreaks the past year, but it has never been this close I to our community. I have received some concerns and questions, so here is some information to know about the Canine Flu.

The Calumet Humane Society does in fact have the H3N2 outbreak and is closed. We also have had some confirmed cases in the town, but it appears that was a couple weeks ago. It is important to recognize the symptoms in order to get your dog diagnosed and treated and also to keep other dogs safe. This virus is highly contagious and symptoms come on fast. Symptoms can mock a respiratory infection. Some of these symptoms include a deep cough (sounds like a honking goose), green/yellow mucus, heavy nasal discharge, vomiting, loss of appetite, and lethargy. Some of these symptoms can be mild to severe. If you notice your dog showing any signs, please contact your Veterinarian and keep your dog away from other dogs. Also, when you arrived at your pets Clinic, please call them to let them know you are in the parking lot. Do NOT just walk your dog in! Most Clinics will have the Vet come out first to assess the dog so they can avoid spreading the virus. There are vaccinations available at most clinics for both H3N2 and H3N8. Please contact your Veterinarian with any questions regarding the vaccinations.

Animal Control has a list of local Animal Clinic if you are in need or are new to the area. We also have other information regarding local rescues, shelters, and wildlife in our area. Remember all pets MUST be registered with the Town of Dyer. You can obtain town tags by bringing proof of rabies vaccination into the Dyer Town Hall.

A Message From Code Enforcement

Garbage Cans - Garbage containers shall be placed out for collection no sooner than 6:00 p.m. the day prior to scheduled pickup, and returned to storage location by 8:00 p.m. on the day of pickup.
