There will be some utility replacement work taking place as well. Additionally there will be some sidewalk replacement occurring as part of this project but please be aware that we will only be replacing those sections that need to be replaced. This is not a wholesale sidewalk replacement. We will be replacing driveway approaches meaning the section of the driveway that is between the sidewalk and the street, with concrete. Due to the curing process related to concrete work that will mean that there will be 7-10 days where residents will not have access to their driveways. The contractor will be instructed to contact residents in advance of this work to give proper notice.

Access to homes will be affected by this road work so please be prepared for some inconvenience during this work. We will strive to minimize the inconveniences but they are inevitable with this type of project. In the end it will all be worth it.

Multi Jurisdictional Storm Water Project

The towns of Dyer, Munster and Schererville have joined forces with the Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission to address a serious storm water problem in the northeast corner of Dyer. As a result of a major storm water pipe failure during a very heavy rain event late last August, a large washout area developed in the Briar Ridge Subdivision. The pipe served as a storm sewer intersection of sorts where storm water from Dyer and Schererville joined and then traveled north under Main St. and into Munster.

As a result of the pipe failure and subsequent washout it was decided that this would be the proper time to replace the large corrugated metal pipe under Main St. through which the water from Dyer and Schererville flows. That pipe was inspected and found to be in poor shape.

The repair/replacement project was designed and put out to bid earlier this year and was recently awarded to Gatlin Plumbing and Heating, Inc. of Griffith. The work is expected to begin in mid to late May and is expected to take up to 75 days to complete. It is anticipated that Main St. will be closed between Calumet Avenue and White Oak Avenue for up to 45 days during that time. Detours will be posted.

This project is an excellent example of intergovernmental cooperation in dealing with a multi jurisdictional problem.
